Business

South West Cleantech Co-investment Fund

The aim of the South West Cleantech Co-investment Fund is to help develop low carbon technologies and innovations with access to crucial growth capital.

The programme will, subject to conditions, provide funding of between £50,000 and £100,000, alongside new equity investments. The Fund will provide business loans which will, subject to certain parameters, match pound for pound new equity capital being issued (for a cash investment) to new shareholder(s) in eligible companies.

Assistance is available to help support entrepreneurs and early stage businesses looking to develop low carbon technologies and innovations with access to crucial growth capital.

To be eligible for consideration for a loan, a company must be based in the South West of England and meet certain characteristics of Cleantech companies. These will include companies involved in energy generation, storage, efficiency and infrastructure as well as transportation. Other business types may be eligible.

The Fund will only provide a loan alongside a pre-approved equity investor – who will be known as a "Keystone Investor".

Interest is fixed at 10% for three years then, at the interest review date, fixed for a further two years, at a rate reflecting commercial rates at the time (in line with EU guidelines on State Aid). Interest will be "rolled up"; calculated on a daily basis and compounded annually.

Caradon Area Community Fund (CACF)

This is a grant programme offering opportunities to grass roots community and voluntary groups in the area formerly known as the Caradon District to receive grants so they may create and/or deliver projects for the benefit of their community. Examples of funding could include the purchase of equipment, an outing, volunteer training etc.

Grants range from £250 - £500.

Restrictions apply including:

- Your turnover must not exceed £20000 per annum
- You must be volunteer led and benefit your community
- You must spend the grant within 1 year

Hilden Charitable Fund

The Hilden Charitable Fund awards grants to projects, both in the UK and in developing countries, with the aim of addressing disadvantage, particularly in support of causes less likely to attract public funding.

The Fund's current funding priorities in the UK are as follows:

- Homelessness.
- Asylum seekers and refugees.
- Community-based initiatives for young people aged 16-25.
- Penal affairs.

Applications are invited from registered charities and other charitable organisations in the UK, although preference is given to charities with an income of less than £200,000 per year.

Grants are rarely given to well-funded national charities, as funding is directed largely at supporting work at a community level within the Fund's categories of interest.

The Overseas Countries funding programme is designed to help small and medium-sized community development, education and health initiatives. Trustees will particularly welcome projects that address the needs and potential of girls and women.

The Fund will be pleased to hear from UK non-governmental organisations or charities and hope that UK NGOs/charities will encourage their local partners, if appropriate, to apply directly to Hilden for grant aid.

Big Lottery Fund Launches Big Local Trust Programme

The Big Lottery Fund (BIG) is investing up to £200 million in between 100 and 150 urban and rural neighbourhoods in England that have been overlooked for funding. The funding is to manage an independent charitable Trust that will support local schemes in the targeted neighbourhoods.

These neighbourhoods are all places that have a history of difficulty in obtaining resources, including funding from BIG. Once operational, the local schemes will enable people to make their communities better places to live in, now and in the future, by helping them develop the skills and confidence they need to identify priorities that matter to them and to take action to change things for the better. Each neighbourhood will roll out the funding over the next ten years.

The first 50 areas **(which includes St Blazey and Par in Cornwall)** each to benefit from at least £1 million of good cause Lottery funding through the Big Local Trust have recently been announced. At least 50 more areas across England due to benefit from the programme will be selected by BIG in the next 12 to 18 months. The Marine Environment Protection Fund is inviting tenders for the provision of a comprehensive overview of the state of current knowledge

in the applicability of Environmental Indicators of Change to the Management of Marine Mineral Extraction. The project is expected to commence mid-August 2010, with work completed by 31 December 2010.

Culture 2007 Programme (2007-2013)

Culture 2007 provides funding to sectoral or cross-sectoral projects that meet at least two of the objectives of:

Environmental Science Research Competitions

A Call for applications (pre-proposals) for transnational research in organic farming and food systems will be launched by CORE Organic II on 1 September 2010.

CORE Organic II is an ERA-NET, and is funded by the European Commission's Seventh Framework Programme. It aims to improve cooperation between national research activities to enhance the quality, relevance and utilisation of resources in European research in organic food

and farming and to contribute to the development and integrity of the organic sector. It does this by making joint transnational calls, selecting and initiating research projects, and establishing the framework for a strategic research agenda as a basis for long-term collaboration between the partner countries.

The funding of the transnational projects in this Call will be based on a 'virtual common pot' instrument. The funding principle is that each country funds its own research group(s), while it benefits from the research results of the multinational team of the Project Consortia. Project duration is limited to a maximum of three years.

FP7- Space

The Space programme is one of the ten thematic areas of the Cooperation specific programme of FP7. The objective of the Space programme is to support a European Space Policy, focusing on applications such as GMES (Global Monitoring for Environment and Security), with benefits for citizens but also other space foundation areas for the competitiveness of the European space industry.

Two main classes of activities to be undertaken are as follows:

- Space-based applications at the service of the European Society, with GMES being central to this activity.
- Providing R&D support to the foundations of Space science, exploration, space transportation and space technology through synergies with initiatives of the European Space Agency or other European, national or regional entities.

FP7- Specific Programme "PEOPLE"

The People programme is one of the specific programmes of FP7. The main aim is support for the training and career development of researchers to make Europe more attractive to researchers. The programme is implemented mainly through Marie Curie Actions.

Two Calls for Proposals opened on 20 July 2010 and are listed below:

For Marie Curie Initial Training Networks (ITN), this action addresses joint research training networks in the form of either multi- or mono-partner ITNs. A multi-partner ITN should involve at least three participants established in at least three different Member States or Associated

Countries. A mono-partner ITN includes a single participant and a network of associated partners. The single participant must be established in a Member State or Associated Country.

The Call deadline for receipt of proposals is 26 January 2011. The 2011 Work Programme (19 July 2010) should be consulted.

For Marie Curie Industry-Academia Partnerships and Pathways (IAPP), this action addresses cooperation programmes between one or more non-commercial research institutions (eg universities/research centres) and one or more commercial enterprises from at least two different EU Member States or Associated Countries.

The Call deadline for receipt of proposals is 7 December 2010. The 2011 Work Programme (19 July 2010) should be consulted.

FP7- Security Research

The Security Research programme is one theme of the FP7 specific programme, Cooperation. It issues Calls for Proposals for non-defence activities, with research focusing exclusively on civil security applications. The objective of the Security theme is to develop the technologies and knowledge for building capabilities needed to ensure the security of citizens from threats such as acts of terrorism and (organised) crime, natural disasters and industrial accidents; to ensure optimal and concerted use of available technologies to benefit civil European security; to stimulate cooperation of providers and users for civil security solutions; to improve the competitiveness of the European security industry; and to deliver mission-oriented results to reduce security gaps.

The 2010 Call for Proposals has now opened. Though published in 2010, the Security Research Call 4 invites proposals to be funded in 2011.
