

VCS EP Pulse Check

Week of 25 January 2021 Results published 01 February 2021

Summary

- 61% of respondents in the London, 32% in the Midlands &
 East, 43% in the North, 19% in the South East and 30% in the
 South West reported significant or major concerns about
 unmet needs in their area in the 7 days prior to data collection
- Mental Health/Isolation, Hardship and Food Poverty were the most frequently mentioned unmet needs in the 7 days prior to data collection
- 30% of respondents reported significant or major concerns about the capacity of the voluntary sector to respond to local needs in the 7 days prior to data collection
- Service Delivery/Capacity, Funding/Sustainability, and Volunteering were the most frequently mentioned issues affecting voluntary sector capacity in the 7 days prior to data collection

About this survey

This survey was conducted between 25 - 27 January 2021. Of 198 organisations surveyed, 156 responses were received – a response rate of 79%.

Respondents were asked to provide a high-level assessment of unmet needs and voluntary sector capacity in the past 7 days and an indication of priorities in the following 14 days.

Respondents were asked for a general assessment based on existing knowledge of local conditions; responses should be interpreted as a rough indication of where gaps exist.

With this in mind, survey results should be used to highlight areas for further exploration and engagement rather than as a definitive picture of unmet needs in England.

Responses are grouped by VCS EP multi-agency cell (see map on p.6).

Refugee families struggling with digital exclusion, they are being missed through usual channels of support

VCSE groups (mostly with buildings) struggling to stay afloat. Ongoing concerns around cuts to third sector services in the forthcoming financial year

People who were just about coping before the pandemic have been hit hard due to furlough and job loss, evidence shows that people living in poorer areas are more adversely affected In this very cold spell fuel poverty is a significant issue for the elderly but also households with children that would normally be empty during the day

There is an ongoing challenge with getting people from rural areas to vaccination sites



In the last 7 days, do you think any of these populations groups were in particular need of support?


In the next 14 days, do you think any of these population groups will be in particular need of support?


